Everyone in those Posts that have grown to 100% or more, and those who have not been at 100% for some time, made this District successful. We are the largest District of Posts, most working together to become bigger, better and stronger than we were last year. Even if it is not where 'we' would like to 'see' our #'s at, remember not all success can be seen on a piece of paper. I am proud of District 6, when I ask for more, most of you gave more and a little extra to membership this year. I thank you, because of your dedication, as we move through our Centennial year; our District is stronger and stands united. I appreciate each of you and never forget ... we all are a part of The American Legion Legacy ... **We are TEAM 100!**
